### **SEPTEMBER WORSHIP SERVICE INFORMATION**

Beginning on Sunday, September 4, 2022, all worship services will return to the church sanctuary. There will be no services in the park for the remainder of this year. Because of Labor Day weekend, on September 4<sup>th</sup> there will be only a 10:30 a.m. worship service.

On September 11 and September 18, 2022, 8:00 a.m. church services will return. On September 25, 2022, there will be a congregational meeting, so there will be no 8:00 a.m. church service that day.

### **Congregational Meeting:**

At the May 9, 2022, Union Council meeting, the plan for merging the three corporations of Huff's Union Church was presented and accepted by Council, and then recommended to be presented to the Congregation for adoption. This will be the final step in merging Huff's Union Church Corporation, Huff's United Church of Christ Corporation and Huff's Lutheran Church Corporation. Upon adoption, The Lutheran and the UCC Corporations will cease to exist and Huff's Union Church will be the only remaining Corporation. The Lutheran Council and the UCC Consistory have already accepted this plan.

In order to take this final step, the attached "Plan of Merger" will be voted on at the congregational meeting scheduled for Sunday, September 25, 2022, during the 10:30 a.m. service. Please note there will be **NO** 8:00 a.m. service on that date. Should a quorum not be reached on September 25th, the meeting will then be held at the 10:30 a.m. service on October 2, 2022, with **NO** 8:00 a.m. service that day. There will be an 8:00 a.m. service on October 2nd if the meeting was completed on September 25th.

- Meeting people via zoom or by phone. Sometimes a zoom call or phone call makes the most sense. You can also text me at my phone number.

## **THANK YOU FROM FRIEND, INC.**

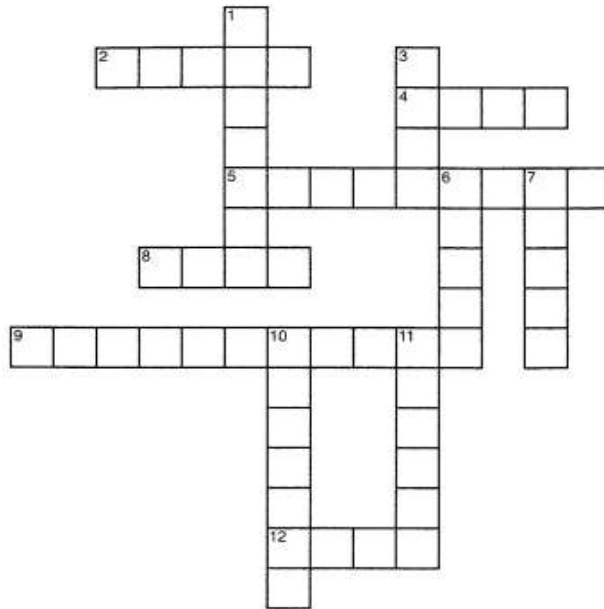
Dear Members of Huff's Union Church,
