ANNOUNCEMENT OF CONGREGATION MEETING

The required quorum to hold the meeting is 50 Active Members. In the event that the business of the meeting cannot be completed for any reason including but not limited to inclement weather, provision of additional information, or lack of quorum, the meeting will be continued to Sunday, December 10, 2023, within the 10:30 a.m. Worship Service. Those Active Members who attend the meeting on December 10 shall constitute a quorum and are authorized to act on this matter even if less than 50 are in attendance. If the voting is done on December 3, then the December 10 meeting will not be held.

Any Huff's Church Active Member may vote, including our confirmed teenagers. Although in-person attendance is encouraged, contact the Church office for Zoom link information. Bylaws do not allow for absentee or proxy voting.
