PASTOR'S ARTICLE THE WAY OF LOVE

The Way of Love is a spiritual journey to help us practice our faith as followers of Jesus Christ. It involves seven movements that lead us deeper into faithful practice. These seven movements are: Turn, Learn, Pray, Worship, Bless, Go, and Rest. We will be going over each of these seven movements during worship in the weeks ahead.

TURN: Like the first disciples, we are called by Jesus to follow Jesus' Way of Love. With God's help, we turn from the powers of sin, hatred, fear, injustice, and oppression. Turning is more than just asking God's help to do better. Turning involves discovering what at our core is making it difficult for us to do better. Turn is the first movement because it reorients to be headed in the right direction.

LEARN: By reading and reflecting on the life and teachings of Jesus, and on Scripture in general, we draw near to God and God's word dwells in us. When we open our minds and hearts to Jesus and to the Scriptures, we learn to see God's story and God's activity in everyday life.

PRAY: Jesus teaches us to come before God with open and humble hearts. In prayer we boldly offer our thanksgivings and concerns to God. When we pray we invite and dwell in God's loving presence, simply listening for God's voice in our lives and in the world.

WORSHIP: When we worship, we gather with others before God. We hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. As we break bread, our eyes are opened to the presence of Christ. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we are made one body, the body of Christ sent forth to live the Way of Love.

BLESS: Jesus called his disciples to give, forgive, teach, reach, and heal in his name. We are empowered by the Holy Spirit to bless everyone we meet, practice generosity and compassion, and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. We can share our stories of blessing and invite others to the Way of Love.

GO: Jesus sends us beyond our circles and comfort, to witness to the love, justice, and truth of God with our lips and with our lives. We go to listen with humility and to join God in healing a hurting world. We go to become Beloved Community, a people reconciled in love with God and one another.

REST: Receive the gift of God's grace, peace and restoration. By resting we put our trust in God.
