UPDATED COVID 19 GUIDELINES

As a result of Governor Wolf lifting Covid restrictions in Pennsylvania the end of June, Church Council has updated restrictions that had been in place during the pandemic.

In all buildings on campus, face masks will be optional for everyone who is fully vaccinated but will still be required for everyone else. Any activities taking place outdoors will not require masks.

Beginning with the July 4th church services, communion will be offered in the pews, with ushers who are masked distributing the elements.

In the park, you may use bandshell benches or bring your own lawn chairs to set up under the bandshell or on the lawn. You may also listen to the service on your car radio in the park.

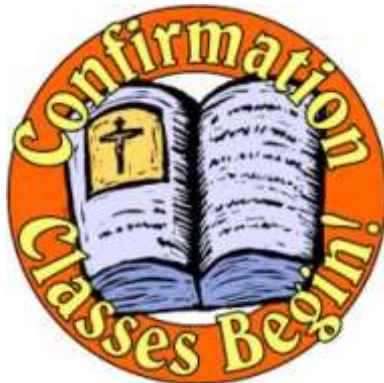

PASTOR'S ARTICLE MOVING FORWARD

Things are slowly returning to a sense of normalcy. Are you getting excited? We are gradually opening up more and more in worship, beginning Sunday School again, and taking our time to get it right. We'll have our August picnic (but the selection of food will be determined by how many volunteers we get, so if you're comfortable, sign-up to help).
